

Cabin Devotions

Day One : Wahabu

Tonight spend a few minutes reflecting on the day, then have everyone memorize this phrase from the day, “Good works are love made visible.” End the day with a prayer or song.

Cabin project for the week: Tonight after a short devotion, introduce a secret project that your cabin is responsible for this week. On Day Three, there will be a special Festival of Good Wishes. Your group must come up with an activity to send off your fellow campers with good wishes. It is limited only by your imagination (and your camp budget, of course). It’s hard to think about saying goodbye when camp is just starting, but take some time to plan something special this week. You have tonight and the next three nights to plan your activity. Camp directors should set a general maximum time guideline based on how many cabin groups there are, for example, five minutes, or up to ten minutes.

Day Two: Umoja

Tonight spend a few minutes reflecting on the day, and then have everyone memorize this phrase from the day, “Celebrating our differences creates unity.” Repeat the phrases from last night and tonight. End the day with a prayer or song, then work on your Festival project (see Day One cabin devotion).

Day Three: Heri

Tonight spend a few minutes reflecting on the day, then have everyone memorize this phrase from the day, “God blesses us so that we may bless others.”

Repeat all the phrases from the week in order. End the day with a prayer or song.
