

Journals

To enhance the camping experience, consider providing each camper with their own personal journal. The following pages are a template for a journal. Copy the pages, placing them inside of one another, trim and staple. This will create a small booklet approximately 5 ½ by 8 inches. Each day contains two to five questions to which campers may choose to respond. These journals should be used in relationship to the theme class. Allow campers approximately twenty-five minutes to complete the entry for Day One. Allow for ten minutes for the other days of the camp. For convenience, the outline of questions is below.

DAY ONE -Have campers complete the wahu journal entry: How does God's love challenge you to better love others and to keep hate from getting in your heart?

DAY TWO - Have campers complete the umoja journal entry: What ways does your culture create or destroy unity among people? How does God help you create unity with others? Do you think It is also important to live in unity with our environment? Why?

DAY THREE - Have campers complete the hen journal entry: What changes do you think need to take place where you live in order to promote hen? What would you most like to change about yourself on the inside, so that your outward actions are more Christ-like?
