TO: US Congregational Financial Officers

On April 10, 2011, President Veazey presented his annual address to the church. In it he laid out an increased vision for the church through five Spirit-led mission initiatives. If you did not have an opportunity to hear him, you can find the text of the address in the May 2011 *Herald* and on the enclosed DVD. You can also find the text and a video presentation at [www.CofChrist.org/presidency/sermons/](http://www.CofChrist.org/presidency/sermons/).

The implementation of these mission initiatives will be facilitated by a change in the way the budget for the World Church is prepared and the way contributors may support the budget. The entire World Church budget, all income sources and related expenses, has been aligned with the five mission initiatives for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011. Beginning September 1, 2011, contributors, through the use of new envelopes, can choose to have their Worldwide Ministries contributions used where needed most or designate one or more specific mission initiatives they wish to support. This will provide contributors the opportunity to continue to identify their true capacity to give generously to Christ's mission.

As congregational financial officer you have an important role to play in helping church members understand and respond to these mission initiatives. The Presiding Bishopric is grateful for the leadership you provide and wants to assist you in this task. This packet of information is designed to provide you with the information you need to successfully participate in the implementation of mission initiative funding in your congregation. Your mission center financial officer is also ready to assist you in this process.



# Community of Christ

## Mission Initiatives: Questions and Answers

### **1. *Is the church launching a new program with the introduction of the mission initiatives?***

The mission initiatives are not part of a program that begins and ends at certain times. They build on our mission statement, the foundation of *We Share*, and the Enduring Principles. They are continuing emphases that ensure Community of Christ is being faithful now and in the future to the full mission of Jesus Christ.

### **2. *Do the mission initiatives replace the church's mission statement: "We proclaim Jesus Christ and promote communities of joy, hope, love, and peace"?***

No. The mission initiatives build on our mission statement—a statement that calls us to pursue the whole mission of Jesus Christ, not just the aspects that most interest us. The mission initiatives are at the heart of that mission and articulate what we mean when we say, "We proclaim Jesus Christ and promote communities of joy, hope, love, and peace."

### **3. *How do the mission initiatives align with our mission statement?***

Our mission statement calls us to "proclaim Jesus Christ and promote communities of joy, hope, love, and peace," which is a call to pursue the whole mission of Jesus Christ. The first three mission initiatives align with Christ's mission as follows:

- *Invite People to Christ* is about Christ's mission of evangelism
- *Abolish Poverty and End Suffering* is about Christ's mission of compassion
- *Pursue Peace on Earth* is about Christ's mission of justice and peace

The next two mission initiatives are about motivating, preparing, and empowering Community of Christ members and congregations for mission:

- *Develop Disciples to Serve* is about equipping individuals for Christ's mission.
- *Experience Congregations in Mission* is about equipping congregations for Christ's mission.

### **4. *Do the mission initiatives replace We Share in Community of Christ?***

No. *We Share: Identity, Mission, Message, and Beliefs* continues to serve as a foundational document. Its guidance for uniquely expressing our vision and mission as a worldwide faith movement helped inform the development of the mission initiatives. The mission initiatives will further aid our understanding of "we share a mission," providing common language for us to describe and live out Christ's mission of evangelism, compassionate ministries, and justice and peacemaking.

**5. *How do mission initiatives relate to the Enduring Principles?***

The mission initiatives build on the Enduring Principles, as well as our mission statement and *We Share*. The Enduring Principles describe who we are called to be. The mission initiatives describe what we are called to do. The mission initiatives are emphases that ensure we are being faithful now and in the future to Christ's mission of evangelism, compassionate ministries, and justice and peacemaking.

**6. *How long will the mission initiatives be a priority?***

The mission initiatives are unceasing emphases that align us with and prepare us for the mission of Jesus Christ. As disciples of Jesus Christ and Community of Christ members, we continue Christ's mission as articulated in the mission initiatives. There will never be a date or time when Christ's mission is no longer our priority. Christ's mission is our mission!

**7. *How do the mission initiatives relate to signal communities...holistic evangelism?***

The mission initiatives add to our understanding of holistic evangelism because they help us understand that we must fully engage in each initiative to successfully reflect Christ's holistic mission. To continue Christ's mission effectively, we must also equip disciples and congregations to be fully engaged in each initiative. When a congregation lives and does Christ's mission of evangelism, compassionate ministries, and justice and peace, then it is a signal community that signals God reigns in individual disciples' lives and in the congregation's life.

**8. *Are leaders being asked to change their field priorities?***

We obviously have congregations, ministers, and members who are actively engaged in Christ's mission in holistic ways. Leaders are asked to engage in that mission with greater determination, alignment, wholeness, and effectiveness. Field teams and International Headquarters teams are asked to consistently use mission initiative language so members and congregations will also become fully engaged in Christ's mission.

**9. *Are resources being developed that will help us introduce the mission initiatives to members?***

Leaders are encouraged to use the resources provided on the web when introducing mission initiatives to congregations and mission centers. The Integrated Formation team has plans for an adult resource and child resource related to envelopes and mission initiatives. These will be available on the Disciple Formation Guide by August at [www.CofChrist.org/dfg/](http://www.CofChrist.org/dfg/).

## **Budget Questions**

**10. *What does mission-based budgeting mean?***

Mission-based budgeting is structuring the budget so all expenses, both support costs and direct costs, are associated with a mission initiative.

**11. How were the tithing goals determined?**

The overall tithing goal of \$14M is the sum of current World Ministries budgeted contributions, Oblation Fund contributions, World Hunger Fund contributions, and other special projects such as Disciple Formation and Congregational Leaders Formation. The worldwide ministries amount represents a 10 percent increase above fiscal year 2011 projection of \$10.4M. Amounts used for Oblation and World Hunger are based on averages for the last three years. Amounts for special projects are the amounts already committed.

Oblation and World Hunger amounts created the tithing goal for Abolish Poverty, End Suffering. Remaining tithing dollars were allocated based on a pro-rata share of expenses for the other mission initiatives.

**12. What if some mission initiatives don't reach tithing goals while others meet or exceed tithing goals?**

We believe contributors will generously respond so that all mission initiatives meet or exceed tithing goals. If a Mission Initiative goal is not reached then we will attempt to balance the budget for each initiative by using the "use where needed most" contributions, endowments, and other revenue. A Contributor Guide is being developed that will address this and other issues. In August, the Contributor Guide will be mailed to all contributors who use envelopes.

**13. What if giving to all five mission initiatives exceeds tithing goals?**

We believe that people will respond enthusiastically by giving to mission initiatives in response to God's abundant grace in their lives. When giving to World Mission Tithes exceeds tithing goals, funds will be available to begin new ministries and expand existing ministries around the world.

**14. Do leaders expect mission centers and congregations to align their budgets to the five mission initiatives?**

Mission centers and congregations are expected to continue to use generosity-based budgeting, which allows congregations to generously give based on their capacity to give, not on an assessment formula. Field Teams are welcome to use the mission initiative structure if it fits the mission planning process for their mission centers and congregations.

**15. Will the church receive updates on mission initiative tithing goals?**

Yes. Church members and friends will receive updates through print, web, and social media communications, as well as in publications like the *Herald* magazine (print and electronic) and direct communication with contributors. We believe it is important for people to read about and hear the stories of people whose lives have been transformed through their generous giving.

**16. Right now the tithing goal for Pursue Peace on Earth is only eight percent of the mission initiative budget. Because we're a peace church, will that change?**

Mission initiative budgeting forces us to look at what we're doing now. It can help us change to better reflect Christ's mission in the life of the church. Also,

remember that justice and peacemaking are found throughout the mission initiative budget.

**17. *Tithing is increasing. Why are we doing this now?***

Moving to mission initiatives is the natural next step for a prophetic people who are going deeper in their discipleship and call to be fully engaged in Christ's mission. This aligns giving with mission.

**18. *Is the contributor base still declining?***

Yes, but at a slower rate than in previous years. Recent response to the priesthood mailing and the upcoming Power of 10 invitations will help increase the contributor base.

**19. *When will the new envelopes with mission initiatives on the "Worldwide Ministries" right side be released?***

People using envelopes in the United States and Canada will receive the new format in August for use starting September 1. They will also receive a Contributor Guide. Envelopes in British Isles and Australia will be available in January 2012.

**20. *What is a Contributor Guide?***

The Contributor Guide is a resource that gives details about the mission initiatives, the many giving options available and other important information. It will be mailed to all persons in the United States who use envelopes. For Canada, British Isles, and Australia, they will adapt the Contributor Guide for their contributors.

**21. *Will there be children's envelopes that include the mission initiatives?***

Yes. The artwork on the children's envelope will complement the art style of "The Story of Jack and Jenn" children's video. You can see the video online at [www.CofChrist.org/Generosity/ChildYouth.asp](http://www.CofChrist.org/Generosity/ChildYouth.asp).

**22. *Will the training resources be in Spanish?***

Yes, training resources that are in the congregational financial officer packet will be translated.

**23. *What about the "share equally" emphasis? Are we still continuing that in our communication to members?***

Yes, we still want to encourage our members in their generosity-based budgeting based on the mission initiative framework. We still want people to share equally between the two sides of the envelope, which is important in the life of the church.

**24. *Will the local side of the envelope for congregations and mission centers in the United States change?***

The answer to this question will be decided by mission center leadership teams because each mission center decides what is printed on the congregation and mission center side of the envelope. Each mission center will have

the opportunity to decide if or when the left side of the envelope for congregations and mission centers will change.

**25. *Can we use mission initiatives on the congregation and mission center side of the envelope for the United States?***

Yes. Each mission center decides what is printed on the congregation and mission center side of the envelope for the mission center area. To change that information, mission center financial officers can contact Carol Stringer at [cstringer@CofChrist.org](mailto:cstringer@CofChrist.org).

**26. *How will Australia and British Isles develop their envelopes?***

Each of these countries will work with the Presiding Bishopric to develop envelopes for use beginning no later than January 1, 2012.

**27. *How will congregational financial officers (CFOs) be trained to work with the new envelopes?***

This packet of information is being mailed to mission center financial officers, presidents and congregational financial officers. Mission center financial officers will support CFOs in the transition.

# Receipting Instructions

## Receipting Contributions

In support of the Mission Initiatives as outlined by President Veazey in his address to the church on April 10, 2011, offering envelopes will be updated to reflect the Mission Initiatives. As indicated on the sample envelopes in this packet, the purpose codes to be used for Worldwide Ministries beginning September 1, 2011, and thereafter are:

Use where needed most—Purpose Code 901  
Invite People to Christ—Purpose Code 902  
Abolish Poverty, End Suffering—Purpose Code 903  
Pursue Peace on Earth—Purpose Code 904  
Develop Disciples to Serve—Purpose Code 905  
Experience Congregations in Mission—Purpose Code 906

The following codes should not be used for contributions received after August 31, 2011.

World Ministries—Purpose Code 900  
Oblation—Purpose Code 970  
Oblation World Hunger—Purpose Code 971

Though the revised envelopes reflecting the Mission Initiatives will not be sent to members until August for use in September, you may receive contributions to be applied to one or more of the Mission Initiatives prior to that time. In order to respect the intent of our contributors, please process those contributions using the new purpose codes above.

## Oblation/World Hunger Contributions

All offerings that previously went to Oblation, including those received on the first Sunday of the month, or during a communion service, will now be receipted to the Mission Initiative, “Abolish Poverty, End Suffering.” This will also be where offerings to World Hunger, including those received on the two World Hunger Sundays, the first Sunday in March and the first Sunday in September, should be receipted.

## Pew Envelopes

Generic, or pew envelopes will also be updated to reflect the new Mission Initiatives. To receive pew envelopes by September 1, please order them no later than July 1, 2011.

## **What is PAT? (Pre-Authorized Monthly Checking Account Transfer)**

If you are recording contributions online through the Shelby system, your congregational members can arrange pre-authorized monthly checking account transfers (PAT) as their method of contributing to both World and Local Ministries. This method of giving provides your members a way to make regular monthly contributions to Local and World Mission Tithes through electronic fund transfers from their bank or financial institution. A sample PAT form and flyer is enclosed. Please feel free to make copies and distribute to your members. More information can be found at [www.CofChrist.org/give](http://www.CofChrist.org/give).

## **Contributor's Monthly Statement (SC-112) (Paper Processors only)**

The SC-112 form has also been updated with new purpose codes and the Mission Initiative Titles. A sample of the updated form is in this packet of information. This form is used by Congregational Financial Officers who receipt contributors manually using the paper process.

The new SC-112 form will be available for ordering after July 1, 2011 and should be used to receipt all contributions beginning September 1, 2011. The SC-112 forms can be order by completing the enclosed *Congregational Financial Officer Supply/Resource Order Form*. Please follow the instructions on the form regarding the different options for returning the completed form for processing. If someone contributes to one of the new Mission Initiatives prior to September 1, and you do not have the revised form SC-112 in hand yet, you may include the contributions in the "Other" section of the current form.

If you are currently using the SC-112 form to process contributions manually, we would like to invite you to explore the option of processing contributions electronically using the Shelby computer software provided by the church. Most congregations use Shelby and find it to be an efficient, effective tool. Those in the USA can arrange pre-authorized monthly checking account transfers (PAT) by filling out the form, at [www.CofChrist.org/give](http://www.CofChrist.org/give) and submitting it securely online, or by printing the form, filling it out, and mailing it to the address on the form. You choose the amounts to contribute to both Local/Mission Center and Worldwide Ministries. You can make additional contributions through offering envelopes in your congregation as well.
