Education Requirements	Bachelor's Degree Preferred with interest in seminary education
Experience Required/Desired	1-3 years as a pastor or member of a pastor team preferred
Immediate Supervisor	As the employer, the Portland Congregation (through an assigned workgroup) will provide direct employment supervision of the Pastor.  As an extended part of the Mission Center staff, the Pastor will participate in monthly meetings with the Mission Center President (usually via Zoom, Skype or telephone) for his or her first year of employment. These meetings are primarily to provide support, mentoring and guidance.  The pastor will also be invited to participate in Mission Center planning, staff meetings, and training opportunities, to receive an understanding of Mission Center objectives and goals. Attendance would not be mandatory but encouraged.  As an employee of Community of Christ, it is understood that Mission Center and World Church policies and procedures are binding on this position.

Summary of Position	The pastor is the key leader who facilitates individual and group disciple formation, pastoral ministry, group discernment, and creative engagement in mission beyond the walls of the congregation. This position leads the pastor team and congregation in the ongoing process of contextualizing the vision and mission of Community of Christ through tangible and relevant ministries.

This position is funded by the Portland, OR congregation and is financially sustainable into the foreseeable future. The congregation is seeking an initial 3-year commitment from the person hired.

In addition to the primary role of pastor, this position also supports the Mission Center as a team member.

Portland Oregon is located in the Pacific Northwest on the Columbia River and is about an hour and a half from the Pacific Ocean. Portland and the surrounding area offer many outdoor opportunities including hiking, fishing, photography, camping, hunting, and probably any outdoor activity you can imagine. The City of Portland is a large metro area with many activities. Along with Portland's diverse outdoor and city activities come a diverse population and opportunities to live and convey Christ's mission. We continue to seek ways to engage with the neighborhood and city and have initiated numerous ministries to respond to human need.


